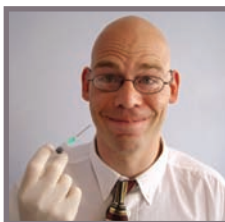

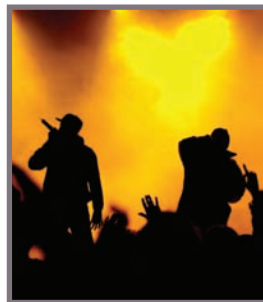

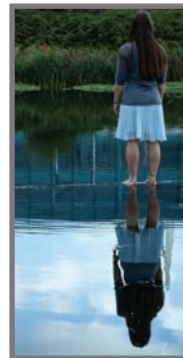

Creative Partnerships

We are proud to be working as a Creative Agent with Creative Partnerships, the government's national flagship programme to develop creativity in schools. This year we continue to work with Oaklands School and Barley Croft Primary and we begin new partnerships with Rushey Mead Secondary and Parkland Primary.

The programmes this year will include a multi-cultural dance project, and a programme exploring how to develop interaction with children who have Autistic Spectrum Disorder.

YMCA Dance Award

Beginning at the end of January we will be running a 10 week programme for young people aged 16–18 who are not in employment, education or training.

Delivered in Hinckley, the Dance Award will take young people who enjoy watching or participating in dance for fun or exercise and give them the opportunity to learn more about aspects of dance.



The award is funded by the ESF Participate programme and will give young people the opportunity to work towards the Bronze Level Arts Award (Level 1).

Victims Voices

We have started a new scheme of work with the Youth Offending Service, funded by Find Your Talent, to consult with young victims of crime. The first phase of this work is a consultation process which will look at what support victims want and need. In the second phase, which will commence in spring 2010, we will deliver a programme designed to meet the thoughts, feelings and ideas of the participants of the first phase.

mY Theatre partnership

We have developed an excellent working relationship with St Barnabas Primary with whom we worked last academic year as part of the Creative Partnerships programme.

We are continuing the relationship, and this academic year activities will include a play in a day for years 1 and 2, a mY Theatre Award (based on the Arts Award) for years 3 and 4 in the spring term, and a mY Theatre Festival for Years 5 and 6 in the summer.
